TIMOTHY D. KUSKI RECEIVES AMCA INTERNATIONAL DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

ARLINGTON HEIGHTS, III., October 16, 2017 — During its 2017 Annual Meeting, held Sept. 28 to Oct. 1 in Stowe, Vt., Air Movement and Control Association (AMCA) International Inc. announced Timothy D. He is past chair of the AMCA Product Efficiency Task Force, which worked with the U.S. Department of Energy on regulation of fan



efficiency for commercial and industrial applications.

Kuski and his wife of 36 years, Jeanne, are the parents of Craig, 28, a product specialist in the Ceiling and Inline business unit of Greenheck, and Maggie, 25, who works in community services for Children's Hospital of Wisconsin. He enjoys hunting, fishing, boating, and camping.
